









SUFI NIGHT

We are happy to share that World Glaucoma Week, is a global initiative to raise awareness about glaucoma, is being celebrated from March 9th to March 15th this year. With blessings of Our chairman sir and under the guidance of Dr Shreya thatte as part of our efforts, we have planned various activities, in SAIMS.

- Glaucoma screening outreach camps in different locations across the city. During the camp we screened 500 patients in 2 days out of which more than 150 patients were 40 years and above ... in 150 patients 10-15 patients were diagnosed to have glaucoma....which were almost 3% of the population and is quite significant.
- These camps are being held in our state-of-the-art Divya Drishti eye bus, which are equipped with cutting-edge facilities for various ophthalmic specialties.
